

## RECREATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

Bird Watching — Wildlife Viewing — Fishing  
Hiking — Hunting — Outdoor Photography

*Conservation Areas are closed from 10 p.m. to 4 a.m. except for authorized fishing and hunting activities.*

- **All public use is prohibited except fishing and waterfowl hunting by boat only, when the St. Francis River water level is at or above 15.5 feet on the Holly Island Gauge.**
- No littering, digging, fireworks, target shooting, open fires, swimming, or camping.
- Motor vehicles are allowed on public roadways, graveled roadways, and in parking areas.
- Do not park in front of or block gates.
- Dogs must be leashed or confined when not used for training or hunting.
- Nuts, berries, fruits, mushrooms, and wild greens may be taken for personal use. The taking of wild greens is prohibited on locations designated as Natural Areas. Destroying, cutting, or removing other vegetation is prohibited.
- Feeding and baiting of wildlife is prohibited.
- Trail and game cameras are prohibited.
- Guiding for pay is prohibited on department areas.

## Fishing and Boating

*Fishing and frogging are allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions:*

- Fish may be taken only by pole and line and not more than 3 poles may be used by any person.
- Daily limit is 6 black bass and 10 channel catfish, 5 blue catfish, 5 flathead catfish, and 30 crappie. Total number of all other fish may not exceed 50.
- All black bass less than 12 inches must be released immediately after being caught.
- Seining or trapping live bait, including tadpoles, is prohibited in lakes and ponds.
- Salvage seining of non-game fish for personal use is permitted only with written authorization.
- Boats may be used for fishing and wildlife-related activities and may not be stored or left unattended overnight.

## Hunting and Trapping

*Hunting is allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions:*

- Only non-toxic shot, as defined by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, may be possessed and used while hunting, with the exception of firearms shooting single projectiles.
- Deer and turkey regulations are subject to annual changes. Please refer to Spring Turkey and Fall Deer and Turkey summaries for current regulations.
- Deer hunting is permitted under statewide seasons and methods except: only archery and muzzleloading methods may be used.
- Only portable tree stands may be placed or used and only between Sept. 1 and Jan. 31. Each stand must be identified with the name and address, or conservation number, of the user and must be removed from the area by Feb. 1. Use of nails or other materials that would damage the tree is prohibited.
- Waterfowl may be hunted under statewide regulations.
- Decoys and portable blinds are permitted, but must be removed from the area daily. Blinds may be constructed onsite, but only from willows and non-woody vegetation.
- Furbearer trapping is permitted only by special use permit.

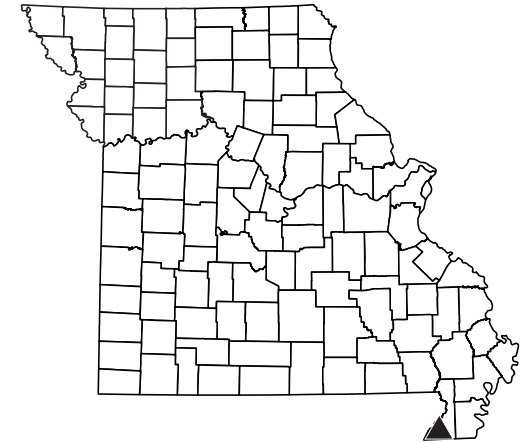
