

Recreational Opportunities

Bird Watching – Bicycling – Fishing – Hiking –
Hunting – Outdoor Photography

Conservation areas are closed from 10 p.m. to 4 a.m. except for authorized camping, fishing and hunting activities.

- No littering.
 - No fireworks.
 - No open fires. Pitted fires only in designated areas.
 - No free-running pets. Dogs must be leashed or confined when not being trained or used for hunting.
 - Destroying, cutting or removing vegetation is prohibited.
- Nuts, berries, fruits, mushrooms and wild greens may be taken for personal consumption only.
- Motor vehicles are restricted to roadways and parking areas.
 - Bicycles are allowed only on trails designated for their use and on roads and trails open to vehicular traffic, unless otherwise posted.
 - Primitive camping is permitted only in areas identified on area map. Camping is limited to 14 consecutive days in a 30-day period. Total camping days on all department lands are limited to thirty (30) days within one (1) calendar year. Groups of 10 campers or more must obtain a special use permit. Persons traveling the Missouri River by boat may camp on any suitable site within 100 yards of the river and moor overnight adjacent to camp but outside the navigation channel between April 1 and September 30.
 - Swimming, sailboarding, scuba diving, water skiing, target shooting, rappelling, water skiing, paint-balling or skateboarding are not allowed.

Fishing and Boating

Fishing is permitted under statewide regulations. The following special regulations also apply:

- On streams, fishing is permitted under statewide regulations. Other restrictions may apply to specific ponds, lakes and stream segments.
- Fish may be taken only by pole and line, and no more than three poles and lines may be used by any one person.
- On impounded waters, daily limits are 6 black bass, 4 catfish in the aggregate (channel, blue and flathead) and 30 crappie. All other fish taken may not exceed a combined total of 20. All black bass between 12 and 15 inches in total length must be returned to the water unharmed immediately after being caught.
- Bullfrogs and green frogs may be taken during the statewide season only by hand, handnet, atlatl, gig, bow, snagging, snaring, grabbing, pole and line, or crossbow, only on waters and within dates and hours

those waters are open to fishing or hunting.

- Seining or trapping live bait, including tadpoles, is prohibited on all impounded waters and their discharge channels.
- Boats may not be stored or left unattended overnight.

Hunting and Trapping

Area is open to hunting under statewide regulations. Deer and turkey regulations are subject to annual changes. Refer to the Spring Turkey or Fall Deer and Turkey booklets for current regulations. The following special regulations also apply:

- Firearms firing single projectiles are prohibited.
- Deer may be hunted by archery methods only.
- Only portable tree stands may be placed or used and only between Sept. 1 and Jan. 31. Each stand must be identified with the name and address or conservation number of the user and must be removed from the area by Feb. 1. Use of nails or other materials that would damage the tree is prohibited.
- Trail and game cameras are prohibited.
- Decoys and portable blinds are permitted but must be removed from the area daily. Blinds may be constructed on-site, but only from willows and non-woody vegetation.
- Trapping of furbearers is permitted only as specifically authorized by special use permit.

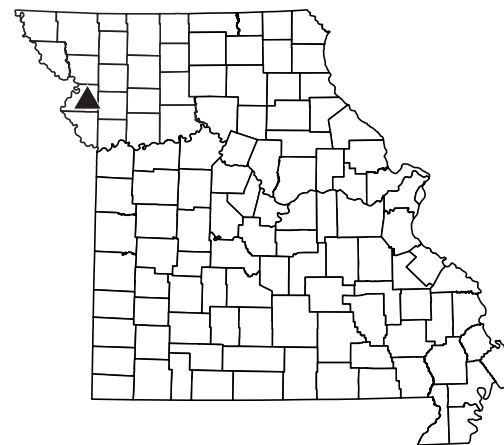
