

RECREATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

Bicycling — Bird Watching — Hiking
Horseback Riding — Hunting — Shooting Range
Outdoor Photography — Wildlife Viewing

Conservation Areas are closed from 10 p.m. to 4 a.m. except for authorized camping, fishing and hunting activities.

- Horseback riding is allowed on roads open to vehicles. Groups of 10 or more need a special use permit.
- Bicycles allowed on multi-use trails and designated service roads year-round. Multi-use trails and service roads (if any) can be located at <https://mdc.mo.gov/discover-nature/places>.
- Hiking is permitted on interior roads and trails.
- Primitive camping is permitted. Campers are limited to 14 consecutive days in a 30-day period. Groups of 10 or more campers need a special use permit.
- Vehicles are restricted to public roadways and parking lots unless otherwise allowed by area regulations.
- Nuts, berries, fruits, mushrooms and wild greens may be taken for personal use. Cutting or removing other vegetation is prohibited.
- Dogs must be leashed when not used for training or hunting.
- For safety reasons target shooting is permitted only at the shooting range.

Hunting and Trapping

Hunting is allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions:

- Deer hunting is permitted under statewide seasons and limits.

- Portable tree stands may be placed and used between September 1 and January 31. Unattended stands must be plainly labeled on a durable material with the full name and address, or conservation number, of the owner and be removed from the area before February 1. Use of nails, screw-in steps, and any material or method that would damage the tree is prohibited.

- Furbearer trapping is permitted by special use permit.

- No hunting is allowed in the shooting range buffer area.

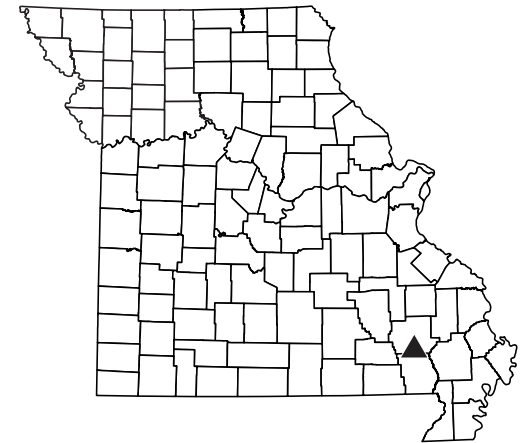
